The National Trust defines cultural heritage tourism as traveling to experience the places, artifacts and activities that authentically represent the stories and people of the past and present. It includes cultural, historic and natural resources.

The city of Chamois is located in Osage County, in the Jefferson City metro area and was founded in 1856. Chamois is named after Chamonix in France, due to its Alpine scenery. Locally residents pronounce the city's name as (Sha-MOYS).

The organizers of this three day conference felt that this quaint little Missouri River community would be the perfect location to highlight cultural and heritage tourism potential. At the conference, you will hear from leaders in tourism, local history, community and economic development, historic preservation, and the arts. Issues that will be addressed include the following:

What are the cultural and historic resources that give your community its special character, and what can be done to conserve them so that you and future generations can enjoy them?

How can you influence policies and decisions on community growth and development so they respect your community's heritage and enhance overall livability?

How can you use heritage as an economic development strategy?
